FINAL REMINDER: The Survey on the Idea of an Ombuds Program for Sport in Canada ends on June 24, 2016

Montréal (Québec) - The Sport Dispute Resolution Centre of Canada (SDRCC) wishes to remind that the online survey on the idea of creating an Ombuds Program for sport will close on June 24, 2016. The survey is open to all members of the Canadian sport community including athletes, coaches, volunteers, parents, officials and staff members.

The survey was developed by a working committee appointed by the Board of Directors of the SDRCC, mandated "to engage in a consultative process to clarify needs and expectations of the sport community with regards to an eventual Ombuds Program, to formulate recommendations pertaining to the scope of service of an Ombuds Program and to evaluate the resources required to establish such program."

The SDRCC invites as many people as possible to take the survey and promote it through their sport organizations' websites and social media, in order for the committee to receive input into what an Ombuds Program for sport could look like in our country.
